### THE 2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B) - 14 JANUARY 2018



We are back to green and have begun the short period of Ordinary Time that takes us up to Lent. This Sunday is actually designated the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time: this is because since Tuesday we have already been in the first week of Ordinary Time and now this Sunday is the start of the second week of ordinary time (a useful reminder that contrary to most calendars and diaries, it is Sunday and not Monday that is the first day of the week). We are in year 'B' of the lectionary cycle, which is the year of Mark: however, we have to wait until next week to become acquainted with the urgency and economy of description in Mark's gospel, as we begin this week with a passage from John's gospel. After John the Baptist points Jesus out as the 'Lamb of God' to some of his own disciples (a significant title, from the son of a priest who knew only too well what lambs were often used for!) Jesus issues a simple invitation 'come and see'. All of us, whether or not we can remember a single moment when this happened, are introduced at some point to the person of Jesus by someone we trust: a parent, a friend, an author or even someone we follow on social media. Perhaps we too can invite someone to 'come and see'?

This weekend we have the annual 'white flower' appeal from SPUC – the Society for the Protection of the Unborn Child. SPUC is one of a number of organisations working to promote a culture of life – their primary focus is campaigning and education around the area of the sanctity of life, other organisations such as the Good Counsel Network focus on providing practical support to mothers who cannot see any option but to end a pregnancy. The message of SPUC is not an easy one for us to hear, and we might well be inclined to go along with the modern idea that what other people choose to do is no business of ours. However, the Catholic faith proclaims very clearly the sanctity of every human life from its earliest beginnings in the womb until its natural end; a large-scale threat to human life is not something we can ignore. The gospel of life as an integral part of our faith, and not something to be embarrassed about. To be pro-life, however, does not mean judging the motives of others or ignoring the real pain experienced by many who are faced with a seemingly impossible situation. We bring such suffering to God in prayer: praying for those who never had a chance to live outside the womb; praying for those who feel unsupported in pregnancy, and praying for healing for those who live with regret and sadness. Let us also offer what practical support we can.

There is an important debate underway about plans to restrict the activity of pro-life groups outside abortion clinics – media reports paint an inaccurate picture of women being intimidated or harassed by noisy protests or aggressive confrontation, far from the reality of peaceful prayer vigils. There are some moving personal testimonies from women who have been helped to continue with a pregnancy that they were on the point of ending – search for 'Isabel Good Counsel' on YouTube for one such story. Sir Edward Leigh MP recently read out the testimony of another woman, 'Kate', during a parliamentary debate, describing how she had to climb out of a window and over three fences to get away from a group of people who had taken her to a clinic and pressurised her into having an abortion – she concluded *"I had my baby who is now three and a half years old. She's an amazing, perfect little girl and the love of my life. I want MPs here today calling to introduce buffer zones to realise, that she would not be alive today, if they had their way."*
